Local Government Reorganisation - A step closer?

Councils in Suffolk, Norfolk and Essex have now published and submitted their final proposals for Local Government Reorganisation. Councils across Hertfordshire and Cambridgeshire continue to work on their proposals ahead of their later deadline of 28 November 2025.

Sharing Learning

Realising the UK's Modern Industrial Strategy in the East of England

The UK's Modern Industrial Strategy, launched on 23 June, provides a long-term framework for enhancing national productivity through innovation, clean growth, and skills development. The Strategy highlights key sectors that the Government considers crucial to the UK's growth mission. The East of England is a cutting-edge leader in several of these sectors, including agri-tech, life sciences, and offshore renewable energy. LGE is working on a refresh to **Opportunity East** to make the case for the importance of the East in achieving the UK's need for growth. This report will set out how the East is delivering the Government's missions, the opportunities for housing delivering and the vital need for investment in the region's infrastructure.



Changes to NHS Regions and Integrated Care Boards



From 1 April 26, the new ICB footprints will be:

- 1. NHS Essex ICB abolishing Mid and South Essex ICB, incorporating West Essex and North East Essex
- 2. NHS Norfolk and Suffolk ICB abolishing Norfolk and Waveney ICB and Suffolk and North East Essex ICB
- **3.** NHS Central East ICB abolishing Hertfordshire and West Essex ICB, Bedfordshire, Luton and Milton Keynes ICB, and Cambridgeshire and Peterborough ICB

Significant structural changes are underway across NHS bodies. In September, the Model Region Blueprint for the NHS was published setting out the changing function of NHS regions. This follows the Government's 10 Year Health Plan which sets out a vision for a more devolved healthcare system that shifts resources from acute hospital into communities. Our LGE briefing on the plan and response from LGE Lead Member for Health and Wellbeing and Leader of Maldon District Council, Cllr Richard Siddall is **here**.

LGE is bringing together NHS and local government regional leads for Adult Social Care, Children's Services and Public Health to consider the risks and opportunities of the changing structural and policy landscape, chaired by Regional Lead Chief Executive for Strategic Health Partnerships and Chief Executive of Bedford Borough Council, Laura Church.



National Neighbourhood Health Implementation Programme

New LGE Event Series: Water Scarcity in the East

LGE has welcomed working with the Regulatory Alliance for Progressing Infrastructure Developments (RAPID) to design a series of water events. The first event on 23 September highlighted that water scarcity is a critical, growing issue in the East of England, with projections showing an 800 million litres per day shortfall in the region by 2050.

Speakers included Paul Leinster, former Chief Executive of the Environment Agency and current Chair of the Cambridge Water Scarcity Group and Water Resources East, and Cheryl Steventon, Director of Programme and Engagement at RAPID. We heard that major investment – over £100 billion nationally in the next five years – will fund new reservoirs, desalination plants, water recycling, and smart metering, while also driving down leakage and promoting water efficiency.



LGE is working together with regulators, water companies, and regional planning groups to secure resilient water supplies, enable sustainable growth, and protect the environment for future generations in the East of England.

Maximising the Social and Affordable Homes Programme

A raft of recent government policy on housing has been welcomed by local councils and the wider housing sector including the £39bn in housing grant, 60% for social rent. The East of England Housing Delivery Group meeting in October, chaired by Alice Macdonald MP, will consider the delivery opportunities of the Social and Affordable Homes Programme in the region.

The Strategic Migration Partnership has updated councils that from 22 September mis/dis/mal information about local asylum seeking populations should be emailed to **CounterEmergingThreats@homeoffice.gov.uk** using the required template and cc. to **Louise.Gooch@localgoveasteng.gov.uk.** A Home Office led Task and Finish Group will take place weekly to share feedback and solutions.
